



Saturday Clubs

The Saturday Clubs have been setup to give young people still at school **an experience of the different engineering disciplines** and encourage them to pursue careers in these subjects. CEME has had many club graduates go onto further education and apprenticeships.

The programme has been running successfully for over seven years now and the students have learned valued skills by practical application. The clubs are an exciting and informative introduction to the world of engineering.

A typical Saturday Club involves the students in lathe work, sheet metal work, electrical work, electronics, car maintenance and CAD drawing.

The items the students themselves make are taken away with them at the end of the course. So far these have included tool boxes, electrical extension leads, electronic buggies, DVD towers and car windscreen scrapers.

Each Saturday Club starts with a parent event to explain the programme and introduce both parents and students to the venue, and the staff involved in the delivery.

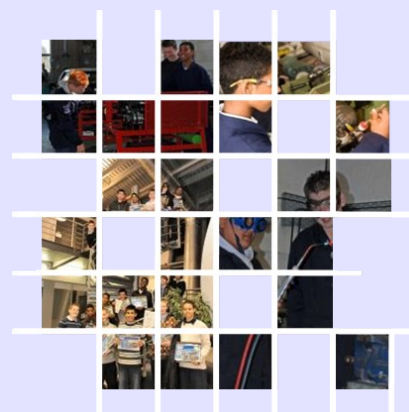
On completion of the club, students and parents are invited to a celebration event. During this event students receive a certificate that can be placed in their Record of Achievement file, an award and the products they made. These can be used by them to take to interviews for apprenticeships, college courses and work.

Students will be supplied with all of the appropriate clothing and equipment that is required.

There is first aid and accident cover at all times. Health and safety risk assessments are made available to both the school and parents of any student who participates in the programme.

The clubs are run at two locations; CEME and Havering College of Further and Higher Education, Ardleigh Green Campus.

The Saturday Clubs are funded from a number of grant sources and local schools.
