



Apprenticeship in Engineering

The “**programme led apprenticeship**” is a fantastic way to gain the key skills needed to start a career in engineering. It combines classroom learning with on- the-job training.

The course has been running for the past 7 years as part of the Gateway to Skills programme. It has led to many of the graduates gaining employment or progressing onto further courses of study in engineering.

This **one year course** will give you:

- An **NVQ level 2** in Performing Engineering Operations
- A **BTEC First Certificate**
- **Key Skills**

Throughout training students will be fully supported by a mentor from CEME’s Gateway to Skills programme.

The courses start in September and continue until the following July. Initially, attendance is 3 days per week; rising to 5 days with placements in local engineering and manufacturing companies.

Completing your apprenticeship doesn’t mean that you are restricted in your career pathways. The course will provide you with **Key Skills** such as:

- communication
- application of number
- information technology
- working as part of a team
- improving your own performance.

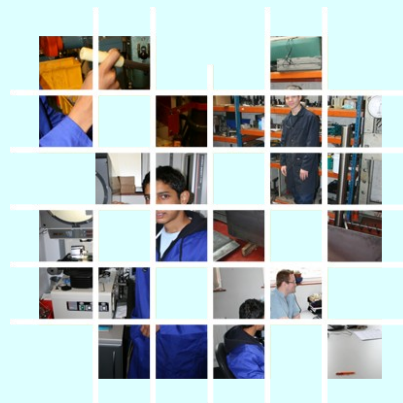
All are skills which are highly valued by companies regardless of size.

Whilst on the course students may be eligible to claim Educational Maintenance Allowance (EMA) .

This depends on the student’s family circumstances .

Support is also available to help with your daily travel expenses, either via the Mayor of London’s Young Persons Oyster card scheme or directly from Gateway to Skills.
